Launched in October 2020, **RISE** (Representation In Clinical Re**SE**arch) is an Amgen program dedicated to improving the diversity and representation of participants in the company's clinical trials. RISE is working to exceed industry standards for clinical trial diversity and representation and to help Amgen develop new medicines studied in participants who better reflect the populations impacted by certain diseases or conditions.

Making information easier to access, trust, understand and use because we recognize that it empowers people to take control of their health and can put better outcomes within reach for more people.

Empowering healthy living



Launched a three-year grassroots program that will raise awareness of cardiovascular health and prevention strategies while engaging and supporting community members to create a culture of health.

Raising awareness among young women, women of color, underserved communities and those facing disparities in bone health and its impact specifically on breast cancer patients



Health Equity Advancement and Leadership (HEAL) program will partner with four local healthcare centers to target upstream social and systemic factors for asthma with an aim to reduce the burden of asthma in underserved populations



'No One Missed' campaign focused on raising awareness of biomarker testing among NSCLC lung cancer patients and caregivers, including in medically underserved communities



PHENPath.com, a first of its kind digital tool to support African American prostate cancer patients in making shared treatment decisions, including those related to bone health



Not One More Life Trusted Messengers Program, aiming to mitigate the impact of COVID-19 in African Americans and Latinos to improve outcomes in respiratory care

Accessible & Inclusive Healthcare

Strengthening the health of communities and care systems so all patients have equal access to a longer, healthier life.

Amgen partnered with Humana to conduct a study among patients who have been hospitalized for cardiovascular-related conditions.

Barriers most often reported by respondents included food insecurity, financial strain, housing quality, and transportation barriers. Amgen and Humana will use the findings to identify, implement, and evaluate potential interventions.
